Discussion:

1. NEFCO Clean Water Plan Ravenna Facilities Planning Area (FPA) Proposed Map and Wastewater Prescription Amendment (Journal Entry #5).

The Haven of Portage County (Haven) is a non-profit organization that is in the process of upgrading and converting a commercial building (formerly on septic) in Ravenna Township into a warming center for the homeless citizens of Portage County. Their intent is to be operational as soon as possible to provide shelter this winter season.

The current NEFCO Clean Water Plan wastewater prescription for the Haven Site, Parcel 29-357-00-00003-000, within the Portage County Sanitary Sewer Jurisdiction of the Rayenna FPA, will be changed from green "Areas will be Served by a POTW (publicly-owned treatment works) or by Home Sewage and Semi-Public Sewage Disposal Systems" to orange "Areas that are Expected to be Served with Sanitary Sewers within the Next 20 Years." The current Ravenna FPA does not have an Orange Prescription definition in the Appendix 3-10 therefore a definition is being added for the color orange. Administrative updates were also corrected in the Appendix.

The Board agreed to move forward with the request./Journal Entry #5.

2. Retirement

Cindy Hazelett is retiring and a Journal Entry is included for today to purchase a retirement gift per the Personnel Policy (Journal Entry #6). Her celebration will be combined with the Department's Thanksgiving luncheon on November 27 and the Board agreed to present the proclamation at 12:30 PM.

BOARD OF ELECTION BUDGET MEETING

Present: Director Faith Lyon, Deputy Director Terrie Nielsen, Department of Budget and Financial Management Director Todd Bragg, Denise Smith, Doria Daniels, Elayne Cross, and Pat Nelson

Ms. Nielsen explained she and Director Lyon received the 2020 proposed budget and are very concerned with the employee overtime line. The Board of Elections requested \$119,094.00 and the proposed budget lists \$40,400. Next year is a presidential primary election and based on the actual overtime hours worked in 2016, the department spent \$104,965.00. There have been increases to employee's pay rates and they are reflective in the \$119,094.00 request for 2020.

Ms. Nielsen also mentioned there may be additional directives necessary from the Secretary of State for cyber security.

Ms. Smith believes it's reasonable to use the exact same number of overtime hours from 2016 and reiterated that it's not only a presidential year, it's also an election year for most County Elected Officials.

Director Bragg explained the salary lines are still being discussed by the Board, but he doesn't want the perception to be that the Board of Election will only receive \$40,400, as that was never the case.

Commissioner Clyde asked about the revised Non General Fund resolution and the Board asked Ms. Brannon to be present, along with Director Bragg, to discuss.

JOB AND FAMILY SERVICES

Present: Sue Brannon and Department of Budget and Financial Management Director Todd Bragg

The Board inquired about the changes to the Non General resolution, whereby the original resolution only listed a decrease of \$1,000 for Job and Family Services and the revised resolution included the decrease, along with an increase of \$10,000 for WIA Allocations and \$215,000 for Child Welfare Special Levy; Total request \$225,000.00.

Director Bragg indicated the original resolution had to be modified because he received additional requests from Job and Family Services after the deadline. Ms. Brannon explained she is unsure about the \$1,000 and Director Bragg explained the \$1,000 was from a budget amendment passed last week by the Board for \$176,000 but Job and Family Services only had \$175,000 certified which presented \$1,000 over certification as indicated by the County

Auditor's letter that needed to be decreased. Ms. Brannon noted the \$215,000 is unappropriated certification on November 12th that she was moving into the expense budget. Ms. Brannon is also unaware of the \$10,000 amount, but noted the department requested \$40,000 from unappropriated funding from a new opioid grant that was received and approved by the Budget Commission at the end of October.

Commissioner Christian-Bennett pointed out Director Bragg is cautioning the Board in regard to additional spending. Director Bragg explained Job and Family Services made a presentation last week that raised concerns about expenses and revenues and he is simply pointing out this action would facilitate further expenses. Commissioner Clyde remarked Ms. Brannon's explanation is that the amount is certified and available, however Director Bragg stated certified means the Budget Commission feels reasonable that the funding is coming in. The Board needs to decide whether the expense is reasonable. The Budget Commission certifying the amount does not relieve the Board from funds being overspent. Commissioner Clyde asked if this is above and beyond what is part of the budget passed a year ago and Director Bragg noted the Budget Commission raised their certification last month and the certification is available so the Board could appropriate. This request increases their budget and Director Bragg explained there were questions last week and if the Board still needs answers, it may not want to move forward with the request. Director Bragg noted he is not reviewing their funds because he hasn't been asked to, but Commissioner Christian-Bennett explained there are reasons to start with Director Bragg because the Board doesn't have much oversight with their funding and she suggests the Board hold off on the revised resolution so she can have several additional questions answered.

Commissioner Kline and Commissioner Clyde agree, based on Ms. Brannon's explanation, that it would be appropriate to move forward with the new request. Commissioner Christian-Bennett noted this is not an advance, but Director Jeffries has asked for an advance in the past and she is interested on how the Board can avoid that in the future. Commissioner Clyde suggests overall expenses could be tracked better by additional communication between the Department of Budget and Financial Management and Job and Family Services,—then conversations back to the Board. Commissioner Christian-Bennett noted it would be a good idea if the Board had more oversight on all the enterprise departments.

CONSENT AGENDA QUESTIONS:

Commissioner Clyde had questions on the following Resolutions:

- 1. Resolution No. 6 (Cash Advance from Fund 0001, General Fund to Fund 3012 GO 2001).
- 2. Resolution No. 7 (Transfer from Fund 0001 General Fund to Fund 3012 GO Bonds 2001 Riddle Block) Cash Advance Riddle Block debt rent is collected and whatever is short comes from the General Fund. Cash advance is needed but when December rents come in a transfer will be done.

Director Bragg responded the County's debt is due on the Riddle Block and the Board receives the rent for the building and whatever shortfall remains between rent and the debt payment must be transferred from the General Fund. The payment is due at the end of November, so a cash advance is necessary until the December rents are

received. Once all the rents have been received, a transfer is done for the difference and the cash advance is pulled back.

In other words, the transfer is required to cover the debt payment from the Courts and the Board will receive the funding back once the Courts approve.

Ms. Tittle asked when the additional tax is retired for the jail expansion at the end of 2020, will there be any accounting on how much money was received and how it was spent and Commissioner Kline replied yes and noted the accounting is always available because it's a separate account.

The Public Hearing was called to order by Commissioner Kline at 10:02 AM on November 14, 2019.

PURPOSE OF THE HEARING:

The purpose of today's hearing is to amend the 2018 CDBG Community Development Grant (Amendment No. 1) Water Facilities Improvements (Ravenna Head Start Waterline) Activity Demolition/Clearance (Windham Township Demolition) Activity.

DISCUSSION OF THE AMENDMENT: Lisa Reeves

Original Activity

Demolition/Clearance (Windham Township Demolition) (Activity 2)

Funds were used to demolish a former church located at 10352 Silica Sand Road in Windham Township and haul-off the building's structural components to an approved landfill, pump, crush and fill the septic system and fill, grade and seed the site in order to eliminate a blight to the neighborhood. \$52,000 (CDBG)

Amended Activity

Demolition/Clearance (Windham Township Demolition) (Activity 2)

Bids for this activity came in lower than anticipated therefore, this activity will be DECREASED by \$27,480 and the funds will be moved to Activity 1, Water Facility Improvements (Ravenna Head Start Waterline) **\$24,520 (CDBG)**

Original Activity

Water Facilities Improvements (Ravenna Head Start Waterline) (Activity 1)

Funds in the amount of \$81,000 are being used to run a water line that will enable the Ravenna Head Start facility, located at 4833 Harding Avenue in Ravenna Township to tap into the City of Ravenna water system. \$81,000 (CDBG) and \$507 (Portage Private Industry Council Dba Portage Learning Center)

The Portage County Board of Commissioners wishes to amend the grant by moving \$27,480 to the Water Facilities Improvements (Ravenna Head Start Waterline), Activity 1.

Amended Activity

Water Facilities Improvements (Ravenna Head Start Waterline) (Activity 1)

In 2018 the Ravenna City Engineer estimated construction and design/engineering for the Ravenna Head Start Waterline at \$81,507. In 2019, an engineer was obtained to complete the design and engineering and based on the estimate the engineer is estimating the construction cost at \$114,317.50.

This activity will be increased by \$27,480 to cover the additional costs associated with the construction of the waterline. \$108,480 (CDBG) + \$20,209.76 (Portage Private Industry Council dba Portage Learning Center) + \$6,000 (Ravenna City) for the cost of the material to increase the size of the waterline.

QUESTIONS/COMMENTS

- 1. Commissioner Kline would like Ms. Reeves to create a table showing the money flow for the project and an explanation of each activity.
- 2. Director Peetz noted they are very fortunate to have excess funding left over in another project they can utilize for this one.
- 3. Commissioner Christian-Bennett pointed out the original proposal had Private Industry Council contributing \$ 507.00 and now they are required to contribute \$20,209.76? Ms. Reeves responded out of the original \$81,000, they are paying for the cost of the engineer, which is more expensive than originally estimated, on top of the bidding costs. Director Peetz noted boring under State Route 14 is a major expense.
- 4. Ms. Tittle asked about the church on Silica Sands Road and if it's located by the Trumbull County border and Ms. Reeves responded it was.

There being no further discussion, a motion was made by Sabrina Christian-Bennett,

seconded by Kathleen Clyde to adjourn the Public Hearing at 10:12 AM. All in favor, motion carries.

Director Peetz is interested in running a display ad for the former Regional Planning Commission building in the real estate section of the Akron Beacon Journal, Record Courier and the Plain Dealer, which is separate from the required legal advertisement. Director Peetz suggested the Board split the cost of the display ad with his department, but Commissioner Christian-Bennett replied since the Board waived the loan payment for the Planning Commission this year, they could utilize that money for the advertisement. Director Peetz mentioned they have new money that just arrived and they could utilize it for the expense. Commissioner Christian-Bennett would rather the Planning Commission pay for the display ad because the County has paid for all the required legal advertisements. Commissioner Kline asked Director Peetz to meet with Director Bragg about the display advertisement and moving it forward since Director Townend is out of the office.

Director Peetz also discussed the Regional Planning Commission and the fact that all 3 Commissioners sit on the Board. He will add a possible by-law change to the discussion items for the next meeting to have 1 Commissioners as the representative and 1 Commissioners as alternate. Currently, there are also representatives from Water Resources, County Engineer and Soil and Water.

Director Peetz will not be in the office this afternoon because he is accepting an award for an 'Honorable Mention' for the mapping program his department is working on and it's technically not officially launched.

In the event such default is not cured by such payment within the specified period, the installments which are delinquent, together with any unpaid carrying charges and penalty and the balance of the connection charges, all of which are due and payable by reason of such declaration, shall be certified by this Board to the County Auditor who shall place the same upon the real property tax list and duplicate against-the-property-served-by-such-connection-and-such chargeshall be a lien on such property from the date the same are placed on the real property tax list and duplicate by the Auditor and shall be collected in the same manner as other taxes; and be it further
- **RESOLVED,** the Sanitary Engineer acting on behalf of the Board, is hereby authorized and directed to certify to the County Auditor such information as will identify the parcel of property to be served by the connection to be paid in installments pursuant to this resolution, the total amount of the connection charges to be paid in installments, the amount of each installment and the total number of installments to be paid. Such affidavit shall, among other things, identify the property to which such lien may attach and shall have attached to it a true and correct copy of this Resolution, including the approval of the terms and conditions by the OWNER and such County. Upon the receipt of the Resolution with such endorsement executed by the OWNER and the execution of such affidavit, the Sanitary Engineer is authorized to issue to the OWNER the permit provided for in Section 1402 of Resolution No. 12-1138; and be it further
