Ms. Smith explained the property has a pre-class one aeration system installed in 1967 that doesn't meet the current technology standards. The Health District issued three NOVs, but the house sold to a new owner during that time period. A point-of-sale inspection was not requested of PCHD, so the Health District began to send NOVs to the new owner. The owner replied by mail with explanations as to why she doesn't believe there is a problem. The Health District addressed each concern and has now involved Assistant Prosecuting Attorney for Portage County, Allison Manayan as well, as the County Auditors Office.

V. DISCUSSION REPORTS

A. Administration and Personnel:

The Health District received the Notice of Award for the Public Health Workforce Grant and Ms. Meduri submitted the first program report.

Ms. Meduri is working with the hiring teams to review applicants and schedule interviews to fill the open positions. The Health District is struggling to attract qualified applicants. Andy Bull filled the Environmental Supervisor position through a promotion internally.

Ms. Meduri is working on scheduling monthly staff meetings and staff trainings for 2022.

B. Fiscal and Accounting:

Ms. Stall stated the Cash Basis Report indicates the Health District is fiscally looking very good at the end of the third quarter. The Health District received multiple grants that were able to offset salaries and help the budget.

C. Nursing:

Mr. Diorio reported out for Nursing as Ms. Ferraro was scheduled off. The Health District is providing Covid-19 booster vaccine at the Health District and at the Elks Lodge in Ravenna. At the October 4th clinic the Health District provided 2 first dose Covid-19 vaccines, 22 Covid-19 booster doses and 26 flu vaccines. At the October 7th clinic PCHD provided 15 Covid-19 booster doses and 2 first dose Covid-19 vaccines. On October 18th PCHD provided 30 Covid-19 booster doses, 3 first doses and 20 flu vaccines. The Health District also went to Skeels and provided 70 Covid-19 booster doses.

The Health District began ordering vaccine for children 5 through 11 years old. There are 10 doses per vial. The Health District ordered 600 doses initially and will assess the demand from there. Adult vaccine consists of thirty micrograms whereas the pediatric vaccine consists of ten micrograms of vaccine. The Health District is waiting on standing orders from ODH.

Board Member Delaney asked if the Health District is still seeing a spike in cases and the severity of the cases. Mr. Diorio responded by stating the information PCHD has received from University Hospitals Portage Medical Center is that 90% of individuals in the hospital are unvaccinated and UH is continuing to see an increase in hospitalizations. Mr. Howard commented the severity of issues leading to what is being called long Covid or *long haulers* which are individuals who experience mild to moderate symptoms for an extended period of time. He further commented that the issues resulting from Covid are wreaking havoc on the health care system due to exceptionally large demand on health care workers. Staffing issues, increase demand on the health care workers among other factors are pushing hospitals to cancel electives. Mr. Diorio reminded everyone that the vaccine doesn't make an individual immune from contracting Covid-19 but should lessen the symptoms and severity.

D. Environmental:

Mr. Rechichar and Mr. Bull secured a grant in the amount of \$29,989.00 from the Association of Food and Drug Officials. Ms. Smith commended them for obtaining another grant to assist the Environmental Health Division.

The Environmental Health staff have been very busy working with contractors to assist them in trying to complete work prior to the weather changing. Mr. Sarfo completed all the MS4 outfall points.

E. Health Education and Promotion & Accreditation:

The Health Education and Promotion staff are continuing to work with Akron Children's Hospital to distribute Pack N' Plays to families. The new IN23 Grant has started on September 30th which allows the Health District to continue the distributing Narcan to the community and providing education.

Ms. Ribelin congratulated the Health District on receiving the Pandemic Response Award from Celebrate Portage. Staff members attended the dinner at NEOMED to receive the award on behalf of PCHD.

F. Women, Infants and Children (WIC):

The WIC program is continuing curbside services until April 2022 and has embarked on a new fiscal year for the program as it closed out its grant and started on the new WIC 2022 Grant.

The WIC program added a new infant formula contract and was granted approval to continue the increase in fruits and vegetables of \$24 per month for children, \$43 per month for pregnant and postpartum participants and \$47 per month for breastfeeding participants.

G. Health Commissioner:

Mr. Diorio commented the Strategic Planning Committee is working on reviewing and updating the Strategic Plan and solicited Board Members to participate in the discussions.

The Community Health Assessment (CHA) is due for renewal. Mr. Diorio is working UH Portage to partner with the Health District and is also putting together a new Steering Committee to guide the decision-making process and revise data.

A. First Reading- Resolution #21-123 Revising Food Service Operations and Retail Food Establishment Fees to Comply with Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3717 and Ohio Administrative Code Chapters 3701-21 and 901:3-4 Fees to be effective December 31, 2021

Mr. Rechichar created a handout explaining the Food Fees. The Board will review information to discuss at the next meeting.

B. The Portage County Board of Health Certificate of Approval for the Maternity Licensure Application for Robinson Memorial Hospital DBA UH Portage Medical Center

The Health District received notification from ODH to review the Maternity Licensure Application for UH Portage Medical Center. Mr. Diorio and Ms. Meduri worked with UH Portage Medical Center and ODH to obtain audit information, review the application and revise the approval form. UH Portage Medical Center successfully completed their survey four months ago with no "conditional" findings and no citations.

C. Accept the Promotion of Andy Bull to Environmental Supervisor

Mr. Diorio asked the Board to formally accept the promotion of Andy Bull to Environmental Health Supervisor. Mr. Bull stated he was very happy to continue to advance at the Health District and enjoys working with everyone.

D. Permission to Post, Advertise and Hire one Registered Environmental Health Specialist

Mr. Diorio stated the REHS would backfill Andy Bull's position. Ms. Smith stated the title change from Registered Sanitarian to Registered Environmental Health Specialist changed as the average person doesn't know what a Registered Sanitarian means. The change was advocated from the Ohio Environmental Health Association to match the National Environmental Health Association titles and exam standards.

Board Member Everett made a motion to Grant Permission to Post, Advertise and Hire one Registered Environmental Health Specialist, seconded by Board Member Ribelin. An "aye" vote was cast by all, motion carried.

E. BOARD ISSUES AND DISCUSSION:

Mr. Howard asked if the Health District could work with the Mental Health and Recovery Board while working on the CHA to create a coalition similar to the Steering Committee to combat opioid overdose and drug management. Ms. Lehman stated the Health District has worked with the MHRB for many years and is attending an annual event regarding mental health and addition at NEOMED on Tuesday. The Health District also partners with multiple organizations through the Narcan program to provide community education and Narcan kits. The Health District will continue the conversations and education surrounding opioid use.

G. EXECUTIVE SESSION:
