### Minutes

### Vice President Tom Hrdy called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm

- Roll Call: Commissioners present: Commissioner Charles Engelhart, Commissioner Tom Hrdy, Commissioner Renee Ruchotzke, Commissioner Allan Orashan. Commissioner Kurt Ruehr had an excused absence. Staff Present: Christine Craycroft, Executive Director; Eric Seachrist, Office Manager; Holly Stoneberg, Education Program Coordinator; Hannah Michael, Intern.
- Public Comment: None. Craycroft used the time to introduce Hannah Michael, Kent State University
  Recreation Management senior, who is employed with the Park District for her full-time internship this
  summer. The Board welcomed Hannah, who expressed great appreciation for the opportunity.
- 3. <u>Approve minutes of the May 8, 2023 Regular Meeting:</u> Upon a motion by Orashan and second by Englehart, the minutes were approved. (JE 2023-29)
- 4. <u>Approve agenda of the June 26, 2023 Regular Meeting:</u> Upon a motion by Ruchotzke and second by Englehart, the agenda was approved. (JE 2023-30)
- 5. Presentation and approval of Financial Statement: May 2023 MTD and YTD Budget Report and Cash Balance Reports: Seachrist indicated that the total expenditures were below a projection of the YTD budget. He noted that some items were higher than the projected YTD budget figure for the account line, but that the overall impact on the budget unit totals were not significant. Upon a motion by Ruchotzke and second by Englehart, the May reports were approved. (JE 2023-31).

  - a. <u>2024 Estimated Tax Budget Public Hearing</u>: Craycroft reviewed the Draft 2024 Estimated Tax Budget as it was presented and on public review. There were no questions.
  - b. <u>DRAFT resolutions Auditor/Board of Elections for levy replacement/additional</u>: Craycroft described the procedure for the Board to place the levy issue on the ballot for the November. The Board must first pass a Resolution of Necessity which is submitted to the County Auditor who certifies the amount the proposed levy would cost the taxpayer, as well as the estimated proceeds. A Resolution to Proceed is passed subsequent to receiving the Certificate. The Park District's counsel at the Portage County Prosecutor's office has been in consultation with Board of Elections, and has drafted the Resolution of Necessity.
  - c. Consideration of calendar and schedule of regular monthly Board meetings. Craycroft noted that there had been a request to consider re-scheduling the regular monthly Board meetings. The Board agreed that the third Monday each month at 5:30PM for the remainder of 2023 would work for all. Staff will ensure required legal notice of the dates.

### **Pilot Deer Archery Program**

### Purpose:

The mission of the Portage Park District is to conserve Portage County's natural heritage and provide opportunities for its appreciation and enjoyment. The Portage Park District continually plans and manages parklands to conserve and restore diverse ecosystems while providing appropriate amenities for public use and enjoyment. Protecting wildlife habitat, biodiversity and water quality requires many approaches, one of which is management of our native White-Tailed Deer population.

The goal of the Portage Park District's Pilot Deer Archery Program is consistent with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources Division of Wildlife deer management strategy "To provide a deer population that maximizes recreational opportunities including viewing, photographing, and hunting, while minimizing conflicts with agriculture, motor travel, and other areas of human endeavor." The Park District is a member of the Lake Erie Allegheny Partnership for Biodoversity (LEAP), and affirms its position on White-Tailed Deer Management which states:

As a regional alliance dedicated to conserving nature for future generations, Lake Erie Allegheny Partnership for Biodiversity (LEAP) members believe that natural communities in our region need to be actively managed and conserved based on scientific principles and best management practices. LEAP members recognize that white-tailed deer (Odocoileus virginianus) are an important component of the biodiversity within the region and have significant economic, ecological, and social value. However, when factors favor high deer populations—such as high birth output, low disease incidence, abundant food supply, and few predators—overabundant deer cause damage to ecosystems and negatively impact human safety. Conversely, in areas of the LEAP region where active, sustained deer management occurs, native vegetation flourishes, habitat quality is high, and conflicts between deer and human populations are reduced. As a result, white-tailed deer populations should be managed to 1) maintain a sustainable deer population, 2) retain the number of deer that a landscape can support while still remaining healthy over the long-term (ecological carrying capacity), and 3) minimize negative deer—human interactions (social carrying capacity).

To manage resources, the Portage Park District is implementing a pilot Deer Archery Hunt program to allow limited controlled bow hunting at designated Park properties. Hunters will be chosen by lottery, and must complete Park District requirements, including qualifications and permit applications, before hunting on Park property.

### **Timeline**

- August 18, 2023: Entries must be received by 4:30 PM. <u>Click here to register.</u> Only one entry per hunter will be entered into the drawing.
- August 21, 2023: Selected hunters will be notified by email. Please do not contact the Portage Park District office to verify if you have been selected.
- September 3, 2023: Mandatory orientation meeting for selected hunters.
- September 30, 2023: Deer season begins.

### **Things to Note**

- Bow hunting of deer will be permitted during the hunting season as specified by the State of Ohio. Hunting areas during this pilot program will be established at Kent Bog Expansion and Morgan Preserve.
- Only one hunter will be permitted to hunt in a designated area unless accompanied by a minor (Person under 18) sharing a tree stand with the permit holder.
- Portage County residents will be given priority in lottery selection.
- If selected, hunters will attend a mandatory orientation. Failure to attend this meeting or to pass the proficiency test will result in forfeiture of the spot, and a new name will be drawn.
- Selected hunters must complete a Hunting Permit Application submitted to the Portage Park
  District Rangers. Selected hunters will be required to verify <u>residency</u> (Valid state of Ohio photo
  identification or driver's license and one document that contains their name and street address,
  i.e., utility bill, pay stub, mortgage statement, etc.) when applying for the permit and show proof
  of a valid Ohio hunting license.
- Permits are NOT transferable.
- Hunters must remain in designated areas. NO EXCEPTIONS. Hunters outside the designated area will have their permits revoked and will not be permitted to return to the premises.
- No fasteners will be inserted into the tree (screw in steps). Hunters must wear a safety harness
  when hunting from an elevated tree stand. Tree stands must be 100 feet off the property line
  and positioned so the hunter is hunting toward the property's interior. Hunter's name, address,
  and phone number must be marked on their tree stand. Hunters must remove their stands no
  later than one week after the end of deer hunting season.
- Hunters must harvest one Antierless deer (doe) before harvesting an Antiered deer (buck).
  - Hunters must fill out a harvest report within 24 hours. Anyone who fails to do so or violates
    the Portage Park District or Ohio Division of Wildlife rules and regulations will be disqualified
    from future lotteries and subject to prosecution.
- Hunters must carry their permits to and from the designated hunting area. Copies are not permitted. Hunters must also display parking tags and park in designated parking areas.
  - o No person shall drive into the hunting areas.
- Hunters must obey all Portage Park District <u>Rules and Regulations</u> and adhere to applicable ODNR rules. <u>Ohio Hunting and Trapping Regulations</u>
- Hunts must possess a map of property boundaries while hunting.
- Feeders are not permitted.
- Hunters must make every reasonable and legal effort to retrieve an injured animal.

### LEAP POSITION STATEMENT ON WHITE-TAILED DEER MANAGEMENT Updated August 2016

POSITION: As a regional alliance dedicated to conserving nature for future generations, Lake Erie Allegheny Partnership for Biodiversity (LEAP) members believe that natural communities in our region need to be actively managed and conserved based on scientific principles and best management practices. LEAP members recognize that white-tailed deer (*Odocoileus virginianus*) are an important component of the biodiversity within the region and have significant economic, ecological, and social value. However, when factors favor high deer populations—such as high birth output, low disease incidence, abundant food supply, and few predators—overabundant deer cause damage to ecosystems and negatively impact human safety. Conversely, in areas of the LEAP region where active, sustained deer management occurs, native vegetation flourishes, habitat quality is high, and conflicts between deer and human populations are reduced. As a result, white-tailed deer populations should be managed to 1) maintain a sustainable deer population, 2) retain the number of deer that a landscape can support while still remaining healthy over the long-term (ecological carrying capacity), and 3) minimize negative deer-human interactions (social carrying capacity).

**BACKGROUND**: The geographic focus area of the Lake Erie Allegheny Partnership for Biodiversity (LEAP) encompasses the Lake Plain and glaciated lands and waters south of Canada from Sandusky Bay to the Allegheny Mountains. This includes portions of northern Ohio, western Pennsylvania, and western New York.

The white-tailed deer populations within the LEAP region share a similar history to other deer populations across North America. White-tailed deer were nearly extirpated from the region in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, at which time conservation measures were enacted to establish sustainable populations. White-tailed deer populations have recovered from historic lows, and today—with few remaining predators, high reproductive rates and survivorship, local ordinances which prohibit hunting, adaptive food habits, supplemental feeding, and low disease-related mortality—the frequency of deer-human interactions has increased in many areas. Examples of deer-human interactions include deer-vehicle accidents, damage to landscaping and garden vegetation, and damage to agricultural crops. Importantly, local deer overabundance critically affects the health of natural areas in our region.

The impacts associated with an overabundance of or excessive browsing by deer have been well-documented (Rooney, 2010):

• Impacts on Biodiversity: An abundant deer population that is out of balance with its native ecosystem has detrimental impacts by both directly and indirectly affecting native plant and wildlife populations, habitat quality, and ecosystem processes (Rooney 2003; Côté et al. 2004).

- <u>Impacts on Plants</u>: When deer become overabundant they reduce the ability of rare and once common plants to survive and reproduce. Deer browsing reduces the height, vigor, and reproduction of plants through the repeated removal of stems, leaves, and flowering parts of plants (Rooney, 2001; Russell *et al.* 2001; Knight *et al.* 2009; Waller *et al.* 2009).
- Impacts on Wildlife: Deer browsing negatively impacts wildlife that needs woodland understory for forage, nesting, and cover. Deer browsing can, for instance, significantly reduce vegetation that birds use for foraging, escaping predators, and nesting (McShea and Rappole 2000; Fuller 2001; Allombert et al. 2005; Chollet and Martin 2013).
- <u>Impacts on the Economy</u>: Deer browsing and antler rubbing cause economic losses in many agricultural operations including row crops, orchards, nurseries, tree farms, and commercial forests, as well as causing substantial damage to landscape and garden vegetation, cemeteries, golf courses, and natural areas (Conover and Kania 1995; Scott and Townsend 1985; Brown *et al.* 2004; USDA 2009).
- <u>Impacts on Disease</u>: Overabundant deer populations can hasten the spread of diseases that impact deer and humans (McShea *et al.* 1997).
- <u>Deer-Vehicle Accidents</u>: An estimated 1.5 million reported deer-vehicle accidents occur in the United States each year and result in approximately 29,000 injuries and 200 human deaths annually. However, only a fraction of actual deer-vehicle accidents are reported (Messmer and Messmer 2008).

**RECOMMENDATIONS**: LEAP members support the following points in regard to the management of conflicts and damage resulting from white-tailed deer:

- We recognize that white-tailed deer are an important and essential component of biodiversity within the region.
- We recognize that reducing wildlife damage is an important part of present-day wildlife management.
- We recognize that acceptable deer population levels depend on the specific situations and management objectives for a given area, and that factors such as deer herd health, ecological impacts from deer, additional threats to forest health, public safety, and social tolerance of deer. All of these factors can often contribute to determining this acceptable level.
- We recognize that when browsing by deer causes habitat deterioration, appropriate deer densities are best managed by site-specific reduction of deer numbers. Areas with low to moderate impacts to plant and animal populations may require a lower degree of herd management than areas with heavy

browsing and the appearance of a browse line.

- We believe that it is important to disseminate information to municipalities, residents, and other interested parties regarding deer management, including information on lethal and non-lethal control options.
- We believe that it is critical to develop and implement education efforts that
  foster an understanding of the biological, social, and economic consequences of
  managing deer populations including the option of no active management.
- We should encourage wildlife biologists and land managers within the region to continue to assess their deer populations and to continue to evaluate effective techniques for deer management.
- We support active control of deer populations (e.g., lethal methods including hunting) on public and private lands in accordance with state and local regulations.
- We support safe management techniques that are deemed most appropriate based on individual situations and best science currently available.
- We will encourage municipalities to work with the Ohio Division of Wildlife to develop safe and effective urban deer management plans to manage the white-tailed deer populations within their city boundaries.
- We believe that deer densities in forests and woodlands should be reduced to a level that, in combination with other appropriate forest management techniques, would allow for the reproduction of canopy tree species, and for the shrub and herbaceous understory layers to return to a healthy condition.

SUMMARY: White-tailed deer management is a critical component of a comprehensive, science-based land management strategy designed to restore a high degree of biodiversity and protect the long-term health and resilience of natural communities in the LEAP region. White-tailed deer have the potential to impact native plant and animal communities. Overabundant deer populations also result in increased numbers of deer-vehicle accidents, as well as an increased potential for disease and parasite transmission. In the absence of management, deer populations can increase beyond the capacity of habitats to support them in the long term, and the quality of habitats deteriorate significantly before any natural mechanisms take effect in limiting herd growth, thereby causing deer health and productivity to eventually suffer. Deer management programs should support an ecosystem balance that sustains a full range of native plants and provides diverse habitat for birds and other animals while also dealing with any identified deer-human interaction issues. At times it is necessary to use human intervention to manage deer population numbers at acceptable levels for desired healthy ecosystems, to reduce nuisance situations, and to increase human safety.

whereas, on June 26, 2023 the Portage Park District Board of Commissioners passed a resolution of necessity for the purpose of (1) operating and maintaining a growing countywide park system, including Trail Lake Park, Towner's Woods Park, The Portage Hike and Bike Trail, Dix Park, Headwaters Trail, Seneca Ponds, Morgan Park, Shaw Woods (2) developing new parks and trails and providing public education and recreation programs for all ages and abilities (3) protecting our rural character and drinking water quality by acquiring and conserving forests, streams, wetlands and other natural areas to levy a Replacement and Additional Tax in excess of the ten-mill limitation at a rate of 1.00 Mill for each \$1 of taxable value, which amounts to \$35 for each \$100,000 of the county auditor's appraised value for a ten year period; and

WHEREAS, the Portage County Auditor has certified to the Portage Park District Board of Commissioners that the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the Replacement and Additional Tax Levy during the first year of collection is \$4,548,000, based on the current tax value of the County of \$4,548,441,210; and

RESOLVED, the Portage Park District Board of Commissioners desires to proceed with the submission of the question of the Replacement and Additional Tax Levy to the electors of the County pursuant to Section 1545.21 of the Ohio Revised Code ("ORC"); and

**RESOLVED,** the question of the Replacement and Additional Tax Levy shall be submitted to the electors in the entire territory of Portage County at the election to be held thereon on November 7, 2023; and

RESOLVED, the Portage Park District certifies the following language to the Board of Elections, Portage County, Ohio, for placement on the ballot of November 7, 2023:

A replacement and additional levy for the benefit of the Portage Park District for the purpose of (1) operating and maintaining a growing countywide park system, including Trail Lake Park, Towner's Woods Park, The Portage Hike and Bike Trail, Dix Park, Headwaters Trail, Seneca Ponds, Morgan Park, Shaw Woods, (2) developing new parks and trails and providing public education and recreation programs for all ages and abilities (3) protecting our rural character and drinking water quality by acquiring and conserving forests, streams, wetlands and other natural areas, that the county auditor estimates will collect \$4,548,000 annually, at a rate not exceeding 1.0 mill for each \$1 of taxable value, which amounts to \$35 for each \$100,000 of the county auditor's appraised value, for ten years, commencing in 2024, first due in calendar year 2025. An existing levy of 0.5 mills for each \$1 of taxable value, which amounts to \$13 for each \$100,000 of the County Auditor's appraised value, expiring in 2023, will be cancelled and replaced upon passage of this levy.

RESOLVED, such replacement and additional tax levy shall be placed upon the tax list and duplicate for ten years, beginning on the 2024 tax year, first due in calendar year 2025; and

RESOLVED, the Executive Director of the Portage Park District is directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections, Portage County, Ohio, before August 9, 2023, along with a copy of the Resolution of Necessity, and the current total taxable value of the county, the estimated property tax revenue that will be produced by the Replacement and Additional Tax expressed in dollars for each \$100,000 of the county auditor's appraised value, as estimated by the county auditor: and
