Paddling safety

Safety first - Know before you go

Summer is in full swing and many people are participating in water activities including paddling. Portage Park District encourages those interested in paddling to review the Ohio Department of Natural Resources <u>safety guidelines</u> for boating safety and hazard descriptions before paddling.

Hazards can include floods and swift water, low-head dams (<u>click here for a video</u> <u>of this type of hazard</u>), strainers (river obstructions that allow water to flow through them), hypothermia, and foot entrapments. Paddlers should know their abilities and the area they plan to paddle prior to their trip.



Another helpful resource is river gauges. The gauges measure streamflow (also known as discharge), which is the volume of water flowing past a given point in the stream in a given period of time. <u>Hiram</u> <u>Rapids</u> and <u>Lake Rockwell Reservoir dam</u> both have river gauges which can be checked prior to planning your paddling trip. **July 2019 Newsletter**
